Reading

Reading – Children in Oak class are expected to read 5 minutes of their reading book at least five times a week. This includes talking about the illustrations, making predictions about the story and giving character descriptions.

This half term we are learning about...

Oak Class: Within this unit, the children will learn about the similarities and differences between them and their peers. They will explore the things that make them unique and share these with others. The children will learn about the different languages we speak in Nursery and make connections between these and the different countries around the world. The children will show interest in the lives of people who are familiar to them and talk about the different customs, special times and routines they

experience with their family and friends. The children will be able to talk about the different people in their families and share about other people and pets in their lives and the important role they play for them. The children will identify and share their likes and dislikes and discuss how these may differ from their friends and family, through this the children will understand the importance of listening to others and showing empathy and understanding when having differing views, interests and opinions.

Acorns Class: Within this unit, the children will learn about what makes them special and unique. They will learn their name and the names of the people important to them. The children will learn to name and describe the things that they like and dislike and begin to give reasons why. Within this unit the children will develop the skills to play alongside and with small groups of other children. They will use both gesture and verbal communication methods to express themselves and interact with others.
